

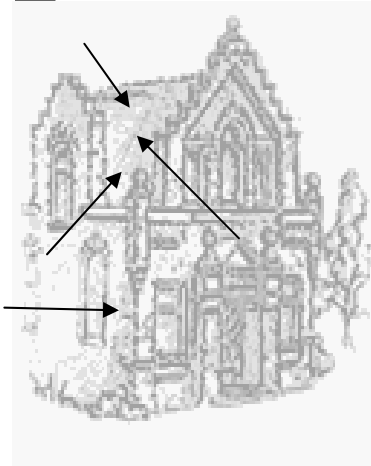

Lively, an award winning author, sensitively describes a dying author's last musings. The novel describes lives that are "molded by personal memory and the collec-

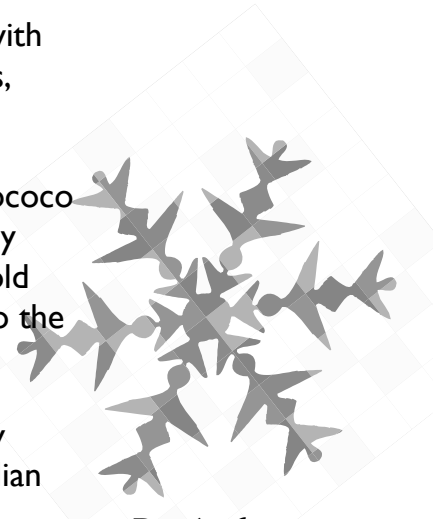
tive past," according to the "Boston Globe."
